Every Child Deserves a Quality Education

More than one half of our grant portfolio is committed to urban education programs. We focus on achieving lasting change in large, urban school districts to improve student performance and increase access to learning opportunities from primary grades to college level. Our initiatives in the United States are centered on driving performance management, developing strong school leadership, enabling innovation through charter schools, and college scholarships. Globally, our current concentration is on improving primary education, literacy and life skills development in India.

Our Funding at Work in:

PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT

Goals: Improve student achievement and a school district's ability to put action plans in place to influence student achievement and graduation rates before the child fails the grade level or the district fails to serve the needs of the child.

Strategy: Foster a leadership culture enabled by the use of technology to gather, share, and act upon relevant and timely information; share best practices between districts.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Goals: Improve student performance through the development of strong urban school leadership.

Strategy: Promote comprehensive, rigorous leadership and professional development programs to enhance instructional and managerial skills; support recruitment of top leadership talent into the field of education.

CHARTER SCHOOLS

Goals: Encourage innovation in high-quality education with the autonomy to try new approaches and introduce new paradigms of teaching youth.

Strategy: Support charter schools that spur healthy competitive pressures and offer a choice in education while presenting opportunities for urban public school systems to learn from the charter's successes and approaches to education; drive charter school quality.

PRIMARY EDUCATION AND LITERACY

Goals: Increase literacy; enable formal education; lower dropout rates to provide the opportunity for life-long success.

Strategy: Improve access to quality primary education for children between ages six and 14, focused in the poorest areas of the largest cities (Delhi, Bangalore, Mumbai, Chennai, Calcutta, Hyderabad).

GLOBAL ISSUES

- One hundred million primary school-age children cannot go to school.
- In the developing world, 17 percent of children do not complete primary education.
- Of the 13 million children growing up in poverty in the US, only half will graduate high school.
- In the US, only one-third of fourth and eighth graders perform at grade level in reading and math.
- India, with more than 400 million children, has 20 percent of the world's out of school children.
- Up to 40 percent of India slum children drop out of school before they reach the fifth grade.
- Recent studies show that 50 percent of India's children in school at the third standard level cannot write or comprehend what they read.

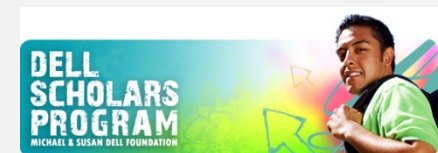
DELL SCHOLARS

Goals: Allow underserved students with determination and financial need to attend and graduate college.

Strategy: Award 250 scholarships per year, providing Dell Scholars with \$20,000 in financial assistance, technology, resources and mentoring to keep students on their path to a four-year degree.

Impact: 1,000 scholarships and \$14 million in scholarship funds awarded. (January, 2009)

Goals: Expand income-generation opportunities to help break the cycle of poverty.

Strategy: Support programs that provide employment-oriented education, assistance and life skills to children and young adults between the ages of 14 and 22.
