

same individual customer disclosures are inappropriate for demand response programs and markets because the nature of the transaction is different. In load participation (demand response) programs, third party providers pay one or more customers to standby and be prepared to drop load when called upon. The amount a demand response provider may pay a particular customer in the program may vary due to a variety of factors, such as the amount of load that can be shed, how quickly their load may be shed, the extent of control over the customer's electric usage the customer is willing to give to the provider, and any number of other factors. EnerNOC stands ready to work with the Chairman to ensure that the original intent of these sections is not harmed while also not doing unintended damage to demand response markets.
