Chronic truancy along with showing disrespect for teachers and school set the stage for CIS case management work with Daniel. Other issues - anger and deciding whether he was going to stay in school or drop out emerged quickly.

CISDR staff worked closely with Daniel to get him to see school as a valuable tool for life not just some place he was required to go. Providing supportive guidance, monitoring his attendance and mentoring brought about a complete change in attitude and performance.

He felt badly about treating his teachers with such disrespect that he approached each and personally apologized for his behavior.

By his senior year he was working in the school office, taking an AP college course and determined to graduate from college and get his Master's in order to open a rehab center to help people in his community. He graduated from high school in 2011.

Last year while attending Eastfield college, he came back to his high school to volunteer. He felt that because of the help that was given him he should give back as well.
